ORDINANCES-SECOND READING/PUBLIC HEARING (PUBLIC MAY COMMENT)

ORDINANCE NO. 2018:03 CALENDAR YEAR 2018 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)-

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken, in the County, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2018 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Pennsauken shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$ 302,886.52, and that the CY 2018 municipal budget for the Township of Pennsauken be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Administrator Kneib explained this ordinance allows the Township to take in money and exceed the 3.5% cap but not to spend it before it comes in.

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken, State of New Jersey ("Township Committee") desires to include definitive specifications in standards for the conditional uses found within 141-84(A)(3)(a) for the manufacturing, processing and storage of petroleum and gas. In accordance with requirements within N.J.S.A. 40:55D-67

The Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken under Article VII: Zoning Regulations, Section 141-84 entitled "HI Heavy Industrial Districts, be and hereby amends to add a new Section G entitled "Conditions for HI Zone" to read as follows:

Article VII. Zoning Regulations

§141-84 HI Heavy Industrial District

G. Conditions for HI Zone for use regulations under subsection A(3)(a)

for the manufacturing, processing or storage of gas or petroleum shall be limited to sites that have
