MINUTES TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING JULY 23, 2020

The Committee Meeting of the Pennsauken Township Committee was held via electronic participation on Thursday, July 23rd, 2020.

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Killion at 6:01pm. Mayor Killion gave time for the public to read how to ask questions and explained it verbally. He gave an update on the number of COVID cases within the Township which is now at 751 with a total number of deaths at 20. He reminded everyone the importance of wearing their mask.

Mayor Killion called for the Salute to the American Flag to be followed by a Moment of Silence.

The announcement of compliance of the "Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act" was read.

CONSIDERATION OF/AND POSSIBLE ACTIONS ON ANY REQUEST FOR ELECTRONIC PARTICIPATION IN MEETING –

Special request for electronic participation in the meeting due to current Covid-19 Pandemic.

Deputy Mayor DiBattista moved the motion to participate via ZOOM. Committeewoman Rafeh seconded the motion. An affirmative 5/0 voice vote was recorded.

The meeting commenced with a roll call by the Township Acting Clerk.

Resolution of the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken, County of Camden, State of New Jersey Authorizing the Township Administrator and Clerk to Execute a Federal Aid Agreement with the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) - Multi Use Trail - \$192,051.05

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) authorized Transportation Alternatives Federal-Aid funding up to an amount of \$192,051.05, for the Pennsauken-Merchantville Multi-Use Trail; and

WHEREAS, this authorization was based on the scope of work and budget agreed upon by the Township of Pennsauken and the NJDOT Division of Local Aid; and

WHEREAS, the Township entered into a Professional Services Agreement with McCormick Taylor, Inc. for Preliminary Engineering, Final Design and Construction Engineering Services for this project; and

WHEREAS, McCormick Taylor, Inc. has completed the activities required for the Preliminary Engineering phase, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Township to execute an Agreement Modification to the Federal Aid Agreement for the Final Design (FD) Activities and authorize McCormick Taylor to proceed to the Final Design phase; and

WHEREAS, work cannot proceed until this Agreement Modification is executed by NJDOT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken that the Township Administrator and Clerk are authorized to execute the attached Federal Aid Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOVED that the Clerk is hereby directed to return four "(4) original signed and sealed copies of the attached agreement along with three (3) signed/sealed Resolutions for execution by the Department of Transportation.

Acting Administrator Palumbo explained this acknowledges the cost increase in the past 5 years for the portion of the multi trail at Cove Road.

Committeewoman McBride spoke of the increase of the design work and asked Mr. Martz if he could verify; which he did. She also commented on the historical study work per the State of New Jersey which also added to the increase. She stated the cost of the construction is \$750,000 but no work would take place until a signed agreement with NJ Transit took place.

No public wished to comment.

Committeewoman Rafeh moved a motion to adopt. Committeeman Dyer seconded the motion. An affirmative 5/0 roll call vote was recorded. *Motion carried.*

Acting Administrator Palumbo suggested Mayor and Committee not adopt the resolution due to the high bid and stated a certificate of available funds received from Mr. Crane, CFO.

Resolution, Accepting, Rejecting, and **Awarding** BID for 2020 NJDOT Municipal Aid Resurfacing of Camden Avenue-BP # 2020-04 to American Asphalt (Base Bid of \$333,366.45).

WHEREAS, bids were received and opened for the bid of Bid Packet No. 20-04 on July 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, this project consists of the improvements of Camden Avenue, from Marlon Avenue to the dead end just past Sherman Avenue. In accordance with Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq, the contract should be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Township consulting engineer has reviewed the bids submitted and has recommended that American Asphalt Company, Inc., 116 Main Street, West Collingswood Heights, New Jersey 08059 which appears to be the lowest responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer recommends to the Township Committee that a contract be awarded to American Asphalt Company, Inc. in the amount of \$333,366.45, representing Items 1 through 31 of the Base Bid.

WHEREAS, funding for this project is being provided by the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) and therefore award of this contract is subject to the approval of the NJDOT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken, County of Camden and State of New Jersey that the Township hereby awards the contract for the FY' 2020 NJDOT Municipal Aid Resurfacing of Camden Avenue Pennsauken Township in the amount of \$333,366.45 for items 1 through 31 of the Base Bid.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Administrator is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the award of this contract.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Township of Pennsauken to participate in the aforementioned program. This resolution is a request to the Township Committee for permission to apply and participate; and

BE IT RESOLVED that if permission is granted the funding will be utilized by the Pennsauken Police Department for equipment related to remote video monitoring of intersection of Route #130 and Marlton Pike. The exact amount of Pennsauken Township's portion of the grant is Ten Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars and Zero Cents. (\$10,450.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the grant will be in collaboration with Camden County Police, Camden County Prosecutor, Camden County Sheriff, Camden City, and Lindenwold Borough.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken that permission is hereby granted to apply and participate in the aforementioned collaborative effort.

WHEREAS, the Township of Pennsauken must advertise for four (4) consecutive weeks for Tax Sale; and

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector may send Two (2) mailings in lieu of any Two (2) publications of the notice of Tax Sale;
