Dear Pennsauken Residents,

As we begin the month of October, it's been almost seven months since the coronavirus first impacted our community. To date, 974 residents have contracted the virus, which include nine new cases that were announced yesterday and today. To prevent a second outbreak, we have to keep making smart decisions. Mask wearing, social distancing, and hand washing are still extremely important. If this morning's announcement from Washington D.C. tells us anything, it's that anyone can contract the virus. We need to keep treating this seriously.

The Camden County Rental Assistance Program, which draws \$4 million from funding provided by the federal CARES Act, is aimed at supporting low income renters at risk of losing their homes or facing an eviction threat due to lost employment or income caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. I would like to thank Camden County, Touch New Jersey, and all of the volunteers for their help with today's food distribution event at the Pennsauken Community Recreation Complex. The County also kicked off its 2020 flu shot program today. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year's flu shot program is being facilitated entirely via drive-thru events. And finally, I'm excited to announce that Pennsauken Township will host a Halloween Movie Drive-In on Saturday, Oct. 24, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., at the Municipal Building Parking Lot. There is no cost to attend
